The **Tusgee Airmen** is the popular name of a group of [African-American](#) military pilots (fighter and bomber) who fought in [World War II](#). They formed the [332nd Fighter Group](#) and the [477th Bombardment Group](#) of the [United States Army Air Forces](#). The name also applies to the navigators, bombardiers, mechanics, instructors, crew chiefs, nurses, cooks and other support personnel.

All black military pilots who trained in the United States trained at [Moton Field](#), the Tusgee Army Air Field, and were educated at [Tusgee University](#), located near [Tusgee, Alabama](#). The group included five [Haitians](#) from the [Haitian Air Force](#), and one pilot from [Trinidad](#).^[2]

Although the 477th Bombardment Group trained with [North American B-25 Mitchell](#) bombers, they never served in combat. The [99th Pursuit Squadron](#) (later, 99th Fighter Squadron) was the first black flying squadron, and the first to deploy overseas (to North Africa in April 1943, and later to Sicily and Italy). The [332nd Fighter Group](#), which originally included the 100th, 301st, and 302nd Fighter Squadrons, was the first black flying group. It deployed to Italy in early 1944. In June 1944, the 332nd Fighter Group began flying heavy bomber escort missions, and in July 1944, with the addition of the 99th Fighter Squadron, it had four fighter squadrons.



Katherine Coleman Goble Johnson (born August 26, 1918) is an [African-American](#) mathematician who made contributions to the [United States'](#) [aeronautics](#) and [space](#) programs with the early application of digital electronic computers at [NASA](#). Known for accuracy in computerized [celestial navigation](#), she conducted technical work at NASA and its predecessor, the [National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics](#) (NACA), spanning 35 years. During this time, she calculated the trajectories, [launch windows](#), and emergency back-up return paths for many flights from [Project Mercury](#), including the early NASA missions of [Alan Shepard](#) and [John Glenn](#), and the 1969 [Apollo 11](#) flight to the Moon, through the [Space Shuttle program](#).^{[1][2][3]} Her calculations were critical to the success of these missions.^[1] Johnson also performed calculations for the plans for [a mission to Mars](#).
